

SUBJECT:

Amendment No. 6 to Agreement with Lars Andersen & Associates, Inc. for Engineering Services Relating to Construction of the Fresno River Trail Undercrossings at Gateway Drive and Union Pacific Railroad Project

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution Approving Amendment No. 6 to the Agreement with Lars Andersen & Associates, Inc, for Engineering Services Relating to Construction of the Fresno River Trail Undercrossings at Gateway Drive and Union Pacific Railroad Project.

SUMMARY:

Lars Andersen & Associates, Inc., (Lars Andersen) has submitted an amendment to their contract for additional engineering services recommended by Staff for modifications of the Fresno River Trail Undercrossings at Gateway Drive and UPRR Project (the Project). The additional services are based on conditions that were unknown at the time of design or related to changes in the Fresno River channel due to fluctuating flows over the last ten plus years. Funds are available for the additional costs in the established budgets.

DISCUSSION:

Construction began on the project in February of this year. Most issues and questions arising during construction have been addressed either by staff or Lars Andersen under their current budget for engineering services. However, there are currently two issues that require engineering services outside of the current contract. Staff is requesting additional engineering support to mitigate a conflict between the current trail configuration, including the protective canopy, and the required clearances for the Kinder Morgan pipeline. Second, a portion of the trail falls within the current low water flows west of Gateway Drive. The City is not authorized to perform any

grading operations to modify the channel flows. Staff felt that it would be best to modify the alignment to move the trail further up the bank out the low water flows.

The City entered into an agreement with Lars Andersen in May 2008 to perform engineering services for the Fresno River Trail Undercrossing at Gateway Drive and UPRR Project, hereinafter called "Project". Subsequent Amendment Nos. 1-5 were processed to gain various agency approvals and constructability modifications prior to advertising the project for bidding.

Lars Andersen has submitted a proposed Amendment No. 6 to their contract for additional engineering services to address the issues noted above. The proposal and fee for services is acceptable and within funds currently programmed for these projects.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The cost for the requested additional engineering services is \$7,970 and will be funded from funds in the Capital Project Account for PK-00008.

There will be no impact to the City's General Fund by approving this amendment.

CONSISTENCY WITH THE VISION MADERA 2025 PLAN:

Strategy 121: Develop a city-wide multi-modal transportation plan to ensure safe, affordable and convenient transportation modes for residents and businesses within Madera.

Strategy 132: Neighborhood Connectivity: Connect Madera's neighborhoods through streets, trails and walkways that promote community interaction.

Strategy 401: Walkable Community: Develop and promote Madera as a walkable community with an emphasis on improving the quality of the natural resources.

ALTERNATIVES:

Should Council not approve Amendment No. 6, the City would need to explore alternate means to address the issues mentioned above halting progress on the project and potentially incurring delay costs.

WHEREAS, Lars Andersen has submitted Amendment No. 6 in response to the City's request to adjust the scope of the project as described therein; and

WHEREAS, adequate funds are available in the project budget for these additional costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MADERA HEREBY finds, orders and resolves as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct.
- 2. The City Council (Council) has reviewed and considered all the information presented including the report to the Council from the Engineering Department.

This Amendment No. 6 to the Agreement for Engineering Services for the Fresno River
Trail Undercrossing at Gateway Drive and Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) Project (hereinafter
called "Agreement"), between the City of Madera (hereinafter called "CITY") and Lars Andersen
& Associates, Inc. (hereinafter called "ENGINEER") is entered into this 15th day of July, 2020.

WHEREAS, CITY has a project to construct the Fresno River Trail Undercrossings at Gateway Drive and UPRR, hereinafter called "Project"; and

WHEREAS, CITY and ENGINEER entered into an Agreement dated May 7, 2008 for professional engineering services to design such street improvements and have entered Amendment No. 1 to Amendment No. 5 to said Agreement; and



We would like to amend your contract to include additional work needed for the project. Please submit a brief scope of work and cost proposal for these additional services.

- 1. Add a plan sheet for construction of pedestrian pathway along the north side of Central Avenue across the UPRR right-of-way connecting to existing sidewalk on either side. This is included in the ATP grant the City received.
 - a. Attend diagnostic meeting on September 14 with UPRR and PUC. \$800.00
 - b. Prepare Exhibits as may be needed for the GO88 (crossing improvement)
 \$1,000.00
 - c. Prepare exhibits as may be required for UPRR \$1,000.00


Thanks for the opportunity to submit a proposal and cost estimate for the above project. Back in 2001, we worked on the bike trail project from Gateway Bridge east to Tulare Street for Valley Planning Consultants. We are very familiar with the project, the project area, potential biological issues, and permitting for the project. Below is a manpower and cost estimate to conduct biological reconnaissance, wetlands, and waters surveys and prepare two evaluation reports for the above project. Our rates are \$100 per hour for biologists and \$25 per hour for technicians. We have also included our Services-Brochure for your files. We can foresee conducting the surveys in July and completing the reports in August.

Biological Reconnaissance Surveys and Report

We will conduct biological reconnaissance surveys to address potential issues involving sensitive wildlife, plants, habitats, wetlands, and jurisdictional waters. Our first step will be to run the California Natural Diversity Data Base to determine sensitive species and habitat occurrences in the project vicinity. We will prepare a map of these findings to determine the location of these records in relationship to the project site. We will then conduct reconnaissance-level site surveys of the project area. We will prepare a report of our findings. At that time, we will evaluate and recommend if additional biological studies, surveys, or reports are necessary.

Wetlands & Waters Evaluation and Determinations

We will conduct a wetland evaluation and jurisdictional waters determination following the U.S.







Army Corps of Engineers' (Corps) 1987 guidelines to evaluate if the project site meets the criteria of wetlands or waters and if they are regulated and under the jurisdiction of the Corps. The Corps has a standard protocol which requires us to conduct our surveys using approved methods. This involves searching for and locating any wetland or waters habitat, taking soil, water, and plant samples to document conditions, completing data sheets for each potential wetland area and an associated upland reference area, and mapping the wetlands if present on a one-inch equals 200-foot aerial map of the parcel. We will assess the site for the three criteria for wetlands involving hydrology, soil, and vegetation. We will determine if wetlands occur on the site and are under the jurisdiction of the Corps. We will take 1-foot deep soil samples and analyze their color, texture, and saturation levels to evaluate the site's potential wetland habitat. We will also sample upland habitat near any wetlands to obtain comparative soil data, as required by the Corps. For wetland vegetation, we will identify indicator species and evaluate their presence and coverage in wetland and upland habitats. We will use aerial and topographic maps, flow records, and visual inspections to evaluate the site's hydrology and if the site meets the criteria of a Waters of the United States. We will prepare an assessment report with data sheets, photographs, maps, and a jurisdictional determination. We will consult with the Corps to determine what permits, if any will be required. We will also evaluate if a Streambed Alteration Agreement will be required from the California Department of Fish and Game, and if an encroachment permit (waiver) will be required from the California Reclamation Board for work within the Designated Floodway.

The above biological surveys and their resulting information will be used in determining the project effects in the environmental documents which would likely be a Mitigated Negative Declaration, and to dispute any of the resource agencies' potential claims concerning biological resources, impacts, and mitigation. The resource agencies are required to use the most recent, best biological information in making their decisions. The "best information" would be that from our surveys and reports.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 7th day of May, 2008, by and between the CITY OF MADERA, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "CITY," and LARS ANDERSEN & ASSOCIATES, INC., a California corporation, hereinafter referred to as "CONSULTANT." The purpose of this AGREEMENT is to provide Engineering Design Services for the City of Madera.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

I. CONTRACT ORGANIZATION AND CONTENT

This AGREEMENT is fully comprised of these terms and the attached exhibit--Exhibits "A", "B" & "C", Scope of Work, incorporated herein by reference.

II. STATEMENT OF WORK

The work to be conducted by CONSULTANT is specified in Exhibit "A" Scope of Work. During the performance of the AGREEMENT, the representative project managers will be:

- City Administrator
- Director of Administrative Services
- Director of Parks and Community Services
- CONSULTANT to the City of Madera as designated by City

III. TERM

The term of this AGREEMENT shall commence on May 7, 2008. CONSULTANT shall complete all services required under this Agreement and this Agreement shall expire May 6th, 2009 unless extended in writing by mutual agreement.

IV. ASSIGNABILITY

CONSULTANT shall not assign any interest in this AGREEMENT without the prior written consent of the CITY.

V. CONTRACT CHANGES

No alteration or deviation of the terms of this AGREEMENT shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties. No oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein, shall be binding on any of the parties.

CITY may request, at any time, amendments to this AGREEMENT and will notify CONSULTANT in writing regarding changes. Upon a minimum of ten (10) days notice, CONSULTANT shall determine the impact on both time and compensation of such changes and

notify CITY in writing. Upon agreement between CITY and CONSULTANT as to the extent of these impacts on time and compensation, an amendment to this AGREEMENT shall be prepared describing such changes. Such amendment shall be valid effective the date of the approved and duly executed amending document.

VI. CONTRACT COSTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS

A. Maximum Contract Amount/Budget Amendments

The City will pay CONSULTANT according to the amount and rates established in Exhibits "B" & "C" in accomplishing the work indicated in the Scope of Work Exhibit "A". In no event shall such payment exceed a total of \$36,280.00 for such services during the duration of the AGREEMENT, notwithstanding the requirement that CONSULTANT shall complete duties as assigned as listed on the Scope of Work, Exhibit "A".

Percentage rates for Consulting Services, Exhibit "B" is the total amount of remuneration that will be paid to CONSULTANT. CONSULTANT will only be paid the lump sums included in this AGREEMENT Exhibit "B" for services directly rendered in accomplishing the work performed in the Scope of Work and will not be reimbursed for any expenses indirectly expended by his accomplishing this AGREEMENT.

CONSULTANT shall bill CITY, and CITY shall pay up to the specified amount to include cost of supplies and prior authorized out-of-town travel expenses. The specified amount of reimbursement may be amended if the Scope of Work requires a substantial change(s). Any amendments to the individual categories within said "Budget" must be approved in writing in advance by CITY and be in accordance with the hourly rates as shown in Exhibit "C".

B. Payments and Report

Payments are authorized under this AGREEMENT. Progress billing in arrears must be submitted as often as monthly by CONSULTANT to CITY. CITY must pay CONSULTANT within thirty (30) days for billing by CONSULTANT. A description of work activities by Task shall accompany each billing and shall specify the percentage of contract work completed.

C. Allowable and Non Allowable Costs & Documentation

All costs charged to this AGREEMENT by CONSULTANT shall be supported by project monthly reports, activity reports, invoices and vouchers, in evidencing proper detail the nature and propriety of the charges.

VII. INSPECTION OF WORK

CONSULTANT and any subCONSULTANTs shall permit CITY the opportunity to review and inspect the project activities at all reasonable times during the performance period of this AGREEMENT including review and inspection on a daily basis.

VIII. STATUS OF CONSULTANT

All acts of CONSULTANT relating to the performance of this AGREEMENT shall be performed as an independent CONSULTANT, and not as an agent, officer, or employee of CITY. CONSULTANT, by virtue of this AGREEMENT, has no authority to bind or incur any obligation on behalf of CITY. Except as provided in this AGREEMENT, CONSULTANT has no authority or responsibility to exercise any rights or power vested in CITY. No agent, officer, or employee of CITY is to be considered an employee of CONSULTANT. It is understood by both CONSULTANT and CITY, that this AGREEMENT shall not, under any circumstances, be construed or considered to create an employer-employee relationship or a joint venture. As an independent CONSULTANT:

- A. CITY shall not determine the method, details, and means of performing the work and services to be provided by CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT.
- B. CONSULTANT shall be responsible to CITY only for the requirements and results specified in this AGREEMENT, and except as expressly provided in this AGREEMENT, shall not be subjected to CITY'S control with respect to the physical action or activities of CONSULTANT in fulfillment of this AGREEMENT.
- C. CONSULTANT, at all times during the term of this AGREEMENT, shall represent and conduct himself as an independent CONSULTANT, and not as an employee of CITY.

IX. STAFFING

There shall be no change in CONSULTANT as Project Manager or members of the project without prior written approval by CITY.

X. SUBCONTRACTING

No portions of CONSULTANT'S work included in this AGREEMENT shall be subcontracted without written authorization by CITY.

All authorized subcontracts shall contain the same applicable provisions specified in this AGREEMENT.

XI. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

A. Termination for Convenience of City

CITY and/or CONSULTANT may terminate this AGREEMENT at any time by giving notice of such termination, and the effective termination date, at least thirty (30) days before the effective date of such termination. In such event, all finished or unfinished documents and other materials shall, at the option of CITY, become its property. If this AGREEMENT is terminated by CITY, as provided herein, CONSULTANT shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred prior to the termination date, in accordance with the cost provisions of this AGREEMENT.

B. Termination for Cause

If through any cause, CONSULTANT shall fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this AGREEMENT, or if CONSULTANT violates any of the covenants, agreements, or stipulations of this AGREEMENT, CITY shall thereupon have the right to terminate the AGREEMENT by giving not less than ten (10) days written notice to CONSULTANT of the intent to terminate and specifying the effective date thereof. CITY shall provide an opportunity for consultation with CONSULTANT prior to termination. In such an event, all finished and unfinished documents, data, studies, surveys, drawings, maps, models, photographs, reports or other materials prepared by CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT shall, at the option of CITY, become CITY'S property. CONSULTANT shall be entitled to receive compensation for all satisfactory work completed prior to the date of receipt of notice.

XII. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

All services performed by CONSULTANT pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall be performed in accordance and full compliance with all applicable Federal, State or local statutes, rules and regulations.

XIII. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

CONSULTANT shall act in an independent capacity in the performance of this AGREEMENT, and not as officers, employees or agents of CITY.

XIV. COPYRIGHTS

CONSULTANT shall be free to copyright material developed under this AGREEMENT with the provision that CITY reserves a royalty-free, non-exclusive and irrevocable license to produce, publish, or otherwise use, distribute, and to authorize others to use, the work for any purpose. CONSULTANT is subject to the duties of agency relating to rights in data and copyrights as set forth in 23 CFR 172.9 (c) and (d). If this AGREEMENT involves experimental research or demonstration work, CONSULTANT is subject to the duties relating to rights to inventions and patents contained in 48 CFR 1-27.

XV. DISPUTES

Except as otherwise provided in this AGREEMENT, any dispute concerning a question of fact, which is not disposed of by mutual agreement, shall be decided by a court of competent jurisdiction.

XVI. HELD HARMLESS

In the furnishing of the services provided for herein, CONSULTANT is acting as an independent CONSULTANT and not as an employee of CITY.

CONSULTANT shall indemnify and defend CITY and hold it, its Council, boards, commissions, officers, employees, volunteers and agents free and harmless from and against any and all claims, lawsuits, judgements, costs, expenses and attorneys' fees on account of injury to

persons or damage to property arising out of or resulting from CONSULTANT'S performance of this AGREEMENT.

During the term of this AGREEMENT, CONSULTANT shall pay for and maintain insurance as listed below:

- A. Comprehensive General Liability Insurance of not less than \$1,000,000.00 limit of liability with a 30-day written Notice of Cancellation in favor of CITY.
- B. When CONSULTANT employs other personnel, CONSULTANT shall provide Worker's Compensation Insurance with a 10-day written Notice of Cancellation in favor of CITY.
- C. CONSULTANT shall furnish CITY with original certificates and amendatory endorsements effecting coverage required by the insurance clause in the Agreement. The endorsements should conform to the requirements of CITY. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by CITY before the AGREEMENT is approved and work commences in the period covered by the Agreement. CITY reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements affecting the coverage required by this Agreement at any time.
- D. Automobile insurance covering automotive liability, any auto coverage, occurrence form. Coverage is to be equal to Insurance Services Office (ISO) Commercial General Liability Form CA 00 01 06 92 covering Automobile Liability, Code 1 "any auto." Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage. Automobile liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:
 - 1. CITY, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by or on behalf of CONSULTANT; and with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of CONSULTANT including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to CONSULTANT'S insurance, or as a separate owner's policy.
 - 2. For any claims related to this project, CONSULTANT'S insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects CITY, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by CITY, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of CONSULTANT'S insurance and shall not contribute with it.
 - 3. Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to CITY.
- E. Professional Liability (Errors & Omissions): \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence with a deductible not to exceed \$50,000, except that a higher deductible may be approved with appropriate documentation, acceptable to the CITY's Risk Manager.

- F. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's Rating of no less than A:VII unless otherwise acceptable to CITY.
- G. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared and approved by CITY. At the option of CITY, either the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects to CITY, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers; or CONSULTANT shall provide a financial guarantee satisfactory to CITY guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration and defense expenses.

XVII. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY/NONDISCRIMINATION

CONSULTANT shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, and with the provisions contained in 49 CFR 21 through Appendix C and 23 CFR 710.405(b).

XVIII. DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE)

It is the policy of CITY that Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs), as identified in 49 CFR Part 23, shall have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of Contracts financed in whole or in part with State or Federal Funds.

CONSULTANT shall ensure that DBEs, as defined in 49 CFR Part 23, have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of this AGREEMENT. In this regard, CONSULTANT shall take all necessary and reasonable steps to ensure that DBEs have the maximum opportunity to compete for and to perform subcontracts arising out of this AGREEMENT.

During the period of this AGREEMENT, CONSULTANT shall maintain records of all applicable subcontracts advertised and entered into germane to this AGREEMENT, documenting the opportunity given to DBEs to participate in this AGREEMENT, actual DBE participation, and records of materials to be purchased from DBE suppliers. Such documentation shall show the name and business address of each DBE SUBCONSULTANT or vendor. Upon completion of the Contract, a summary of these records shall be prepared and certified correct by CONSULTANT, and shall be furnished to CITY.

XIX. AUDITS

At any time during normal business hours, and as often as CITY deems necessary, CONSULTANT shall make available for examination all of its records with respect to all matters covered by this AGREEMENT for purposes of audit, examination, or to make copies or transcripts of such records, including, but not limited to, Contracts, invoices, material, payrolls, personnel records, conditions of employment and other data related to all matters covered by this AGREEMENT. Such records and access to the facilities and premises of CONSULTANT shall be made available during the period of performance of the AGREEMENT, and for three years after CITY makes final payment under this AGREEMENT.

Any notice or notices required or permitted to be given pursuant to this AGREEMENT may be personally served on the other party by the party giving such notice, or may be served by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the following address:

Exhibit "A" - Scope of Work For the

Fresno River Bike Trail Under-Crossing at Gateway Drive and UPRR (Federal Funded)

Consultant shall provide you, the City of Madera, with engineering services for the Fresno River Bike Trail Under-Crossing at Gateway Drive and UPRR (Federal Funded), a connection from existing Bike Trail, just east of State Highway 99 to existing Bike Trail, approximately 150 feet east of UPRR. Also, consultant will evaluate and provide two (2) preliminary alternates route/alignment for City to select which will best fit the needs of the community. All project documents shall comply with FHWA standards and requirements.

- I. <u>Stage 1 Research and Field Survey</u> (see Survey Task for more detail)
 - 1. Research for record data, as-built plans right-of-ways and easements.
 - 2. Coordinate the required Topographic Survey to City.
 - 3. Perform Design Field Survey to establish grades for proposed bike trail and locate existing facilities.
 - 4. Verify location of utilities with the utility companies.
- 2. Stage 2 Preliminary Design (30%) (See Civil Engineering Task for more detail)
 - 1. Review existing City recommendation and documentation with regard to trail improvement plans within the route of the proposed improvements.
