Consideration of applications for a General Plan Amendment (GPA 2024-01) and Prezone (REZ <u>A-1</u> 2024-02) pertaining to ±19.90 acres of land, comprised of 11 parcels, bounded by Adell and Fairview Streets on the south and west and the Madera Irrigation District Canal (Lat. 24.2) on the north and east, in the County of Madera (APN[s]: 038-060-017, 028, 032 & 033 and 038-110-016, 017, 018, 019, 020, 021 & 022)
